Basics of Squid Fishing on Party Boats

During the RISAA Party Boat Night Squid Trip last year, most of the members aboard caught 2-8 squid. At the same time, Tom and his wife Dawn, and their 13 yr. old nephew filled three buckets!

And Erica, another member who was fishing next to Tom, was given some advice on squid fishing and then she proceeded to catch 80 squid that night!

One of the best things about Tom is that he's always willing to share his knowledge of fishing.



"Squid have huge eyes," says Tom. Realizing this fact makes a difference in his ability to draw in and catch squid, and also factors in on the fishing gear he uses.

During this mini-seminar, Tom plans to share some of the squid fishing trips he's learned such as:

- when to fish deep vs when to fish near the top
- how to "pitch" your lure to draw the squid in closer
- what's the right rod/reel and line to use
- best squid lures

This seminar will not only be helpful to members going on this year's RISAA Squid Trip, but also to any member who wants to pick up tips for your own squid fishing.

Fishing The Tube & Worm

Sometime in the early 1960's, well over 50-years ago, Charley Soares and his inquisitive and talented friend, Freddy St. Louis, began experimenting with the tube and worm.

"I'd had a great deal of experience in using sea worms to catch stripers on the original Cape Cod and Niantic Bay spinners but those lures could not stand up to fish in the upper teens," said Charley.

His friend obtained some 3/8 ID latex tubing which they dyed dark red and they were off to the races.

"In the roughly 50 years that I have been using the tube and worms I have made numerous enhancements and changes and won over thousands of converts," he said. "The uniqueness of the tube is that it catches numerous species along with stripers from five to fifty pounds."

Charley's presentation will cover the basics from building and fishing, as well as acquiring and storing the bait.



Charley is a full-time writer and guide who fished Cuttyhunk and the Vineyard for the past 50 years and currently serves as Field Editor for *The Fisherman* magazine and feature writer for *On The Water* magazine. He has been writing a weekly newspaper outdoor column for the past 20 years. Charley published his first book on fishing the tube and worm over 30 years ago and has five other books to his credit.
