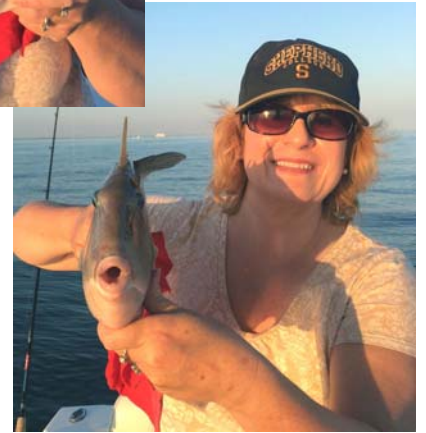
displays a pair of 24.5" walleye that he caught last July using a bottom bouncer rig with a nightcrawler during his 15th annual Quebec fishing trip.

Striped bass over 34 inches?



You must remove the right pectoral fin

It's the law in Massachusetts & Rhode Island



Any person recreationally harvesting a striped bass thirty-four (34) inches or larger shall at the time of harvest have the right pectoral fin removed at a point as close to the body of the fish as possible.

WHY?

The fin-clipping regulation helps to prevent the "stockpiling" of striped bass. Stockpiling occurs when fish are harvested on a closed commercial day and then offered for sale on an open day. It also prevents RI caught fish from being illegally transported and sold in other states.

Licensed fish dealers in MA and RI are not allowed to purchase a fish with it's fin removed.
